<u>Prior Learning:</u> understanding that anyone can author on the internet, begin to understand that copying text from a website is the equivalent to stealing (plagiarism), begin to understand that what is on peoples' websites belongs to them

- Begin to understand the concept of copyright, e.g. what images, videos or sounds are legal and safe to use in their own work.
- Identify how copyright restrictions can affect how a file can be used in their own work (plagiarism)
- Understand that you should not publish other peoples' material on the internet without their permission but you can hyperlink or embed their work.
- Be aware that file sharing is usually illegal due to copyright laws and can also spread viruses.
- Understand some of the potential dangers and impact of not validating information.
- Understand that judgements are made on people based on online content.
- Understand there are people who will actively try to upset others online.
- Understand how to make a positive contribution to their online communities.
