Key historic local landmarks: cannon dents at St Elphin's church, statue of Crowell, the cottage where Cromwell lodged, The Peace Centre.

Democracy/dictatorship/monarchy

Cromwell is one of the most controversial figures in the history of the British Isles, considered a dictator by many historians, a military dictator by Winston Churchill, but a hero of liberty by others; he temporarily ended monarchy rule.

Enduring understanding:

Cromwell had a significant impact on the rule of law in England; he ordered the death of a king and the temporary end of the monarchy; he also became the Lord Protector.

There are many ways in which a country to be run: Monarchy/Democracy/Dictatorship
The children need to link the idea of other dictators that have ruled and the impact they had: e.g.
Hitler WW2.The children need to consider whether Cromwell was a national hero or an evil dictator
